Between taking classes, doing an internship or going on vacation, students have many options for how to spend their summer break and fall term.

Why not experience all three? With GSC's Summer or Fall semester [Study Abroad Program in Cambodia](#), students can participate in a mix of academic enrichment, cultural immersion, service-learning, and international travel, all while earning 9 academic credits in the summer and 15 in the Fall semester.

These programs are offered in partnership with the University of Albany-SUNY (UAlbany) and provide an opportunity for students to gain an understanding of:

“The Role of Civil Society and Buddhism in Post-Conflict Cambodia.”

GSC's 9-week Cambodia [Summer Study Abroad Program](#) offers 9 credits with two start date options, from **June 6, 2016 – August 7, 2016** and **June 20, 2016 – August 21, 2016**. Students in this program participate in a hands-on service-learning internship while living and working with local communities. The program includes:

- One week of in-country orientation and training
- Basic Khmer language lessons
- An introduction to local culture and customs, including historical sightseeing trips
- A weekend excursion to Siem Reap and UNESCO World Heritage Site Angkor Wat
- Monday through Friday applied service-learning experiences serving with a Cambodian community organization
- Independent study assignments and supervision by a UAlbany Professor of Anthropology
- Free weekends to further explore Phnom Penh and beyond

- A true cultural immersion experience, including a homestay depending on your service placement

GSC's 16-week Cambodia [Fall Study Abroad Semester Program](#), **September 5, 2016 to December 25, 2016**, allows students to earn 15 credits. The program includes:

- All of the same features described above for the Summer Program
- Structured classes at the beginning of the semester and before starting the service-learning field placement
- Capstone project
- Academic supervision by a UAlbany Professor of Anthropology

Credit for both the Summer and Fall programs is available through UAlbany, or can be arranged through your own institution. For pricing and more information, check out our [Students page](#).

In addition to the semester programs, GSC also offers [service-learning programs](#) for students and non-students alike. Programs are available in the areas of Global Public Health, Buddhist Immersion, Teaching English, Children and Orphanage Care, and Community Development and Youth Leadership Training. Start dates are available every month and you choose how long you want to stay and which program is right for you. Interested students can also arrange for Independent Studies credit through UAlbany or your own university.
